## How Does The PROMISE Work?

Scholarships will fund either a certificate program, a two-year Associate's Degree or the first two years of a Bachelor's Degree at Muskegon Community College or Baker College of Muskegon.

Students are encouraged to apply for all scholarship opportunities available to them. Other scholarships and grants will be awarded first before the **PROMISE** Scholarship is awarded.

The **PROMISE** covers tuition (valued at the current Muskegon Community College rate), books, and mandatory fees.

Students will have a maximum of four years from high school graduation to use **PROMISE** Scholarship monies to earn a maximum of 62 credits, the equivalent of an Associate's Degree from Muskegon Community College.

The amount of the **PROMISE** Scholarship may be adjusted each year based on any revised financial aid information.

# What Do You Need To Do?



**LIVE** within the boundaries of the Muskegon Area Intermediate School District (MAISD).



**GRADUATE** with a cumulative 3.5 GPA or higher from a high school located within the boundaries of the MAISD.



**APPLY** for federal student aid using the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and complete the verification process as requested each year (www.fafsa.gov).



**ENROLL** at either Muskegon Community College or Baker College of Muskegon.

No scholarship application is needed for the **PROMISE** award. Rather, students will be notified with a letter of eligibility and asked to accept the award in writing each spring.

Students must successfully complete their coursework to maintain eligibility. Each college's *Satisfactory Academic Progress* policies apply.
