Technology

Fruitport Community Schools is dedicated to integrating technology into the curriculum.

Elementary: 5 computers in each classroom, five computers in the media center, and 1 additional computer lab at Shettler and Beach. Edgewood has 2 computer labs for student use.

Middle School: At least 1 computer in each classroom, 5 computers in the media center, and 3 additional computer labs for student use. All students participate in a standards based curriculum that is an introduction to computers and information technology.

High School: At least 1 computer in each classroom, 20 computers in the media center, and 4 additional computer labs for student use. High school class offerings include: Business Services and Technology (BST), Web Page Design, Media Production, and Drafting and Architecture Design (CAD).
