You Turn students receive instruction and guidance from a licensed teacher.

You Turn is offered to Muskegon County students who show a willingness to participate and recognize the value of returning to school to complete their education.

What You Turn Is...

You Turn is a voluntary program that was created to meet the needs of students who have been expelled from their middle or high school. This program offers opportunities for students to make positive changes in their behavior and attitude, allowing them to successfully return to their school after period of expulsion.

Requirements...

Before students begin *You Turn*, the parent(s) or guardian and the student must meet with program staff for an interview to discuss the student's past education, the reason for expulsion and future goals. While students attend *You Turn*, they will be working in a multi-grade classroom setting and are required to actively participate in individual and group activities that are created to promote positive social skills and productive behaviors. Students will get a combination of individual and group instruction in Math, Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies. Students also use Edgenuity, a computer based Instructional program that helps in credit recovery.
