

Criteria for Student Participation in the Adult Community Transition Program

- 1) Minimum age for participation is 17 years old.
- 2) Participants should not exhibit behaviors that could put themselves, other students, or staff at risk
- 3) Participants should be independent in performing daily living activities such as eating, toileting, showering (YFCA), etc.
- 4) Desire and expectation to live, work and play at a minimum of supported level.
- 5) Work skills training program requires participants to provide a current physical and TB test (no older than 12 months).
- 6) Participants are expected to attend Adult Community Transition (ACT) Program on a full time basis.

Application Procedures

- 1) Participants should be referred in the spring of the year for their participation in the ACT program during the next school year.
- 2) Special education administrator should contact the Wesley School Principal (773-9158) to arrange visitations, pre-IEPC observation and interview.
- 3) Complete Adult Community Transition Referral Form and return to the Principal at Wesley School along with any other appropriate assessment information.
- 4) Invite both the Transition Program instructor and Wesley School Principal to the student's spring IEPC meeting.
- 5) Limitations in class size require that priorities be established. A student's age, and program availability at their local district will be significant factors in determining if a student will be accepted into the program.
