

Community Transition Classroom

The Community Transition Program, which is operated through Wesley School, is designed to give students with developmental disabilities, who are ages 18-26, an opportunity to gain independence in their home, at work, and in the community.

Learning activities utilize local shopping centers, recreational opportunities, community employers, and public transportation to perform real life tasks that enable them to transition from school to employment or community living. Participants learn daily living skills, communication skills, functional academics, mobility, interpersonal skills, leisure skills, and employability skills through their activities in the community. Successful participants in the Community Transition Program will exhibit the skills necessary for supported employment and/or community living.

Participants work closely with Muskegon Community Mental Health, Michigan Rehabilitation Service, as well as many other human service agencies throughout Muskegon County. Referrals to the Community Transition Program are made through the local school district's special education director.
