Dear Parents & Guardians:

Today, December 13 we were informed that a person in your child's GSRP classroom tested positive for COVID-19 on Friday, December 10. This person last attended class on Thursday, December 9. This case will now be noted on our [COVID-19 Dashboard](#).

Due to masking and other precautionary mitigation procedures, this classroom is remaining open at present time. However, your child and others may have been exposed, and we understand it is your choice whether your child attends or not. If you choose to have your child remain at home during this time, the absence will be considered "excused." **As a further classroom precaution during the upcoming days, staff will be conducting multiple daily temperature checks of each child attending class.** If we notice spikes in children's temperatures in coming days, we will re-evaluate the status of classroom operations.

**We ask that each family monitor your child for symptoms very closely.** As a reminder, COVID-19 symptoms include a temperature greater than 100.4 degrees, sore throat, a new, uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty in breathing, new onset of diarrhea, headaches, vomiting, unusual belly pain, or new loss of taste/smell. Please contact your medical provider if your child displays these symptom(s), keep your child at home, and report the absence to us.

Public Health has also provided these reminders:

- Wear a mask (covering mouth and nose) while in public places
- Limit social gatherings and practice social distancing (stay 6 feet apart)
- Wash your hands frequently, cover coughs and sneezes, and stay home if you are sick
