Dear Career Tech Center Parents & Guardians:

Today we learned a student who attends the Career Tech Center with Group B (Thursday/Friday) has tested positive for COVID-19. We wish the student a speedy recovery. **This student was at school today but did not ride the bus. There are no other students that were in close contact with the student (within 6 feet for 15 minutes or more).** With spring break starting tomorrow, the student will return to the Career Tech Center on Thursday, April 15 if the student is symptom free.

This case will be noted on our <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u> today. Thank you for understanding that, due to medical privacy laws, we are not able to release the name of the individual who tested positive.

Career Tech Center staff and students have been carefully following our safety protocols outlined in our Return to School Plan and we have increased our efforts to clean and disinfect equipment, light switches, door knobs/handles, and bathrooms, in addition to our regular cleaning/disinfecting schedule.

As a reminder, if your child has been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19, or they have been exposed and are awaiting test results, please do not allow them to attend school. Remember, a person does not always display symptoms before testing positive for COVID-19. Please help limit the spread of COVID-19 by checking your teen each morning for symptoms.

Public Health has also provided these reminders:

- Wear a mask (covering mouth and nose) while in public places or if people visit your home
- Limit social gatherings and practice social distancing (stay 6 feet apart)
- Wash your hands frequently, cover coughs and sneezes, and stay home if you are sick
- Get tested if needed and consider getting vaccinated
