Oakridge Public Schools is a comprehensive school district that provides programming and educational opportunities for all district residents from preschool age through adulthood. We have a Community Senior Center, Great Start Readiness Program (preschool program), and Fusion program. Our building grade configurations include K-3 at the Lower Elementary, 4-6 at the Upper Elementary, 7-8 at the Middle School and 9-12 at the High School. We enjoy strong community support. The community extended our 7.7 mill levy in 2010, generating \$8.6 million for investments in capital outlay needs. We benefit from the 2014 Regional Technology & Security Enhancement Millage generating 1.0 mill of revenue for 10 years (\$330,000/year). This funded the expansion of single secure entries to our schools, one laptop for every student in grades 7-12, and Chromebook carts and iPads for all other grades. We have established the Oakridge Wellness Network which includes a Teen Health Center in partnership with Hackley Community Care. Private donations have provided community health worker services from Mercy Health Hospital's Health Project. A partnership with DHS provides a Pathways to Potential Center on site. Kids Hope, Empowered Kids, and other community organizations partner with us to support kids mental and behavioral health.
