## Dear Parents & Guardians:

Today a person tested positive for COVID-19 at the MAISD Transition at Craig Campus. The parents of affected students in this classroom were immediately contacted and went home. According to public health and CDC guidelines, close contacts are now required to quarantine for 10 days. Two people who ride the bus were identified as close contacts and have been told they must quarantine as well.

Due to strict classroom cohort groups, no other classrooms are directly impacted by this positive case and <u>no</u> other students need to quarantine. Because the person tested positive, this case has been noted on our <u>COVID-19 Dashboard</u>. Thank you for understanding that, due to medical privacy laws, we are not able to release the name of the individual.

Craig Campus staff have been carefully following the safety protocols outlined in our Return to School Plan and we continue to diligently clean and disinfect equipment, light switches, door knobs/handles, and bathrooms, in addition to our regular cleaning and disinfecting schedule.

While the health and safety of our students, families, and staff is our top priority, **some students** may not be able to consistently wear masks or social distance due to their physical or cognitive disabilities. That's why it is very important for you to check your child each morning for symptoms. If your child does show symptoms, contact your health care provider. Public Health has also provided these reminders:

- Wear a mask (covering mouth and nose) in public places or if people visit your home
- Limit social gatherings and practice social distancing (maintain a distance of 6 feet apart)
- Wash your hands frequently, cover coughs and sneezes, and stay home if you are sick
- Get tested if needed and consider getting a vaccine. Learn more at maskupmuskegon.org.

We are grateful to our parents who have given permission to allow their children to be tested. This allows us to quickly respond and stop future spread of the COVID-19 virus. We will continue to provide weekly rapid testing of both students and staff who do not have symptoms and have no known exposure to a person with COVID-19.
