Dear Parents & Guardians:

Today Public Health-Muskegon County confirmed that two people who attend or work at the Transition at Craig Campus were told they must quarantine for 14 days due to possible exposure to COVID-19. They are “probable” cases which means they are positive, or will likely become positive, over the next few days. Public Health-Muskegon County has required these two people to isolate at home. Your young adult did NOT have close contacts with these two people on the bus or at school.

For these reasons, Public Health-Muskegon County does not consider your young adult a close contact of the positive cases and your young adult may continue attending the Transition at Craig Campus for in-person learning. As always, if your young adult shows [symptoms](#) of being sick, they must stay home. Staff and participants from the impacted class will not return to our school until Thursday, January 28.

Thank you for understanding that, due to medical privacy laws, we are not able to release the name of the individual. Because the two people are probable, this case will be noted on our [COVID-19 Dashboard](#).

While the health and safety of our participants, families, and staff is our top priority, **some participants may not be able to consistently wear masks or social distance due to their physical or cognitive disabilities**. That’s why it is very important for you to check your young adult [each morning for symptoms](#). If your young adult does show symptoms, contact your health care provider.

Public Health has also provided these reminders:

- Wear a mask (covering mouth and nose) in public places or if people visit your home.
- Limit social gatherings and practice social distancing (maintain a distance of 6 feet apart).
- Wash your hands frequently, cover coughs and sneezes, and stay home if you are sick.
- [Get tested](#) if needed. Your young adult can get a test at school if they don’t have symptoms and have not been exposed COVID-19 by contacting the office.
