

Dear Parents & Guardians:

Yesterday, Sunday, November 1, 2020, we were notified that a student from Wesley School tested positive for COVID-19. That student had no symptoms and was last at school on October 27, 2020. No student or staff person at Wesley School was with the student 48 hours before the student tested positive. As there was no close contact during the infectious period, there are no quarantines of Wesley staff or students that must take place related to this student.

This is our second positive case at Wesley School, but this case was not connected with the first. We are thankful that we made the decision to move to remote learning until November 12 to help limit the spread of COVID-19. Because the person tested positive, this case will be noted on our COVID-19 Dashboard. Thank you for understanding that, due to medical privacy laws, we are not able to release the name of the individual.

The health and safety of our students, families, and staff is our top priority. Even though we are not in school, please keep checking your child <u>each morning for symptoms</u>. If your child does show symptoms, contact your health care provider. Please call the school if your child tests positive. Public Health has also provided these reminders:

- Wear a mask (covering mouth and nose) in public places or if people visit your home
- Limit social gatherings and practice social distancing (maintain a distance of 6 feet apart)
- Wash your hands frequently, cover coughs and sneezes, and stay home if you are sick
- Get tested if needed
